THE INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS



EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

The Early Childhood Programs covers Kindergarten One and Two. We are guided by the Curriculum implemented by the Early Childhood Commission, in the delivery of our classes. We focus on key areas such as: Numeracy, Phonics, Vocabulary/Spelling, Spanish and General Knowledge. This program is being offered full-time and parttime, both online and in-person. (All face -to-face classes will be held in Kingston, Jamaica)

PREPARATORY SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The Prep School Program focuses on laying a strong foundation for the PEP Exams sat in Grade Six, and by extension - Secondary School. For Grades 1-2 we focus mainly on mastery of all rudimentary concepts. For Grade 3, we begin preparations for PEP, in order for there to be a smooth transition throughout Grades 4-6.

SECONDARY SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Our High School Programs extend to Upper Sixth Form. We offer all subjects sat at the CSEC and CAPE Levels. Students, however, must meet internal criteria when choosing subjects for CSEC in Grade Nine. A similar process takes place in Grade Eleven when our students are choosing subjects for CAPE.

MODALITY OF CLASSES



For the 2021-2022 academic year, classes will be held online using Zoom. Each class will have no more than five (5) students. By keeping the class size small, we are able to ensure our students receive the attention they all may need, without interruption.

Our classes will be taught under the guidance of the concepts outlined int he National Standard Curriculum and also the Early Childhood Commission. Four our Secondary students, we ensure strict observation to the syllabus guidelines for each CSEC and CAPE subject, to guarantee our students' success.

HOMEWORK CLUB

We know that due to different circumstances our parents may not necessarily be able to assist our students with homework assignments. As such, we have implemented, "Homework Club", in an effort to provide students and parents with the needed help. This program does attract an additional cost of two thousand five hundred dollars, (\$2,500.00) weekly.

Remedial Classes

> There is one hour allocated at the end of each school day for remedial sessions, for students who may have challenges in different subject areas. (Should parents be interested in sessions which extend for a longer time, there is a cost attached)

TUITION

Early Childhood Programs \$70,000 per term

Preparatory School Programs \$75,000 per term

Secondary School Programs \$60,000

For parents who may be interested, payment plans are available once requested.

MORNING DEVOTION

As a school, we welcome all students from different religious backgrounds and we respect the beliefs and customs of all our families, both religious and cultural. As such, we do ask students to join devotion at 7:25 a.m. Students are not mandated to participate but should be in attendance.

This time is also used for morning registration and to share important announcements and daily reminders.



This time is allocated for afternoon registration and also afternoon devotion.

Students are not mandated to participate in the devotional activity, but should be present for registration purposes.

RESOURCES

We do not distribute formal resource lists, as we source all materials and make each available on soft copy for student download.

The teachers provide at maximum five (5) textbooks for the specific subjects. The teachers will also instruct parents at what time during the school year to purchase these materials.

Though many find this strategy unconventional, we have found that it is effective. This method holds our teachers accountable for ensuring the books are actually used.

Community Service Program

As a school, we are firm believers in volunteerism. For students in Grades 5 - 11, we ask that they devote thirty (30) hours of voluntary service for the entire school year.

Different dates will be allocated for submission of community service forms for each Grade Level.
